History of Pilgrimage

Pilgrimage originated as the Roman Catholic “Cursillo” movement in Spain in 1948 and moved to America in the late ‘50s. In addition, the Roman Catholic and Presbyterian movements, there are similar weekends in the Methodist, Reformed, Episcopal, Lutheran and other Christian churches. More than 2 million Christians in 50 nations have attended a weekend. The first Pilgrimage in Michigan was held in April of 2005, we now have participants representing over 160 different churches and 20 denominations.

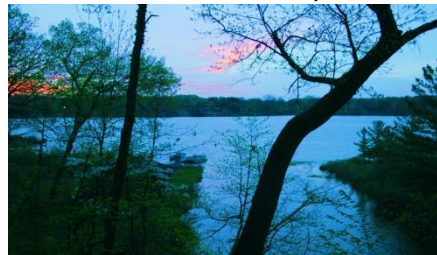
